Purpose and Legal Basis

Scope of Data

Depending on the communication channel selected, we may process:

- name and surname;
- company name;
- e-mail address;
- telephone number;
- information regarding your professional role.

Withdrawal of Consent

You may withdraw your consent at any time by:

- contacting X at [email address];
- clicking the unsubscribe link included in marketing e-mails;
- informing us that you no longer wish to receive marketing communications.

Withdrawal of consent does not affect the lawfulness of processing carried out before withdrawal.

Recipients of Data

Your personal data may be accessed by:

- IT service providers;
- e-mail marketing service providers (if used);
- providers supporting our communication systems.

Retention Period

Marketing data will be processed until:

- you withdraw your consent; or
- we cease marketing activities requiring such processing.

After withdrawal, certain information may be retained where necessary to demonstrate compliance with legal obligations.

Your Rights

You have the right to:

- access your personal data;
- rectify inaccurate data;
- request erasure;
- request restriction of processing;
- object to processing;
- withdraw consent;
- lodge a complaint with the competent supervisory authority.
